- 3. Introduction (OC Chair Greg Thompson; Director of Comp(Dave Rees)

#### 8. Stadium

 Morning: four lanes finishing; then will change this into three lanes for freestyle technique

#### 9. Courses

- o 5 km
- Classic part of track still have technique zone, will mark it better for tomorrow (whiskers at start and finish, maybe some vee boards) – diagonal technique – one pole (or no poles) in snow at a time
- o 10 km cuts off from 15 km (will be marked) then climbs hill.
- It became crowded in the Meadow area where racers were cheering on teammates – please remind athletes who are cheering to not crowd the race track

## 10. Ski testing and warming up

- O Ski wax testing -Skate or classic up / glide down
- Warmup track will have both classic and skate
- Please do not warmup on public trail; gets confusing to race organizers if they see a racer with bib on public trails – may feel that the racer has taken a wrong track; please wear jacket over bib or bib turned inside out if skiing on public trails

# 11. Course Preparation and Grooming

- o No feed stations tomorrow since only 10 km
- Groomed this evening; groomed for classic for morning; then at noon hour, inside track will be erased for skate skiing event course will be closed during grooming time between AM and PM races.

# 12. Information from the TD (Claude Laramee)

- Great day. Thank you to national directors for passing down info to skiers; today lots of skiers went through Kastle arch so that shows that the message went through to skiers. Thank you.
- Wax testing on public slope not a good mix when skiers are testing skis with the public. There are four lanes to test skis in warm-up section. Please use it.
- The jury was busier today:
  - One skier DQ'd b/c did not complete course
  - Four skiers with issues in TZ (indications will be much more visible tomorrow); DS or herringbone with no glide and one pole on snow at a time or no pole that's the rules.
    Simple. Athletes will receive verbal comment from Claude, and national directors will be asked to contact the athletes for tomorrow
  - Two skiers were sent back out to do their second lap after crossing finish line on first lap (indications were clear; might be lack of experience/nervousness – we send them back out
  - Evacuated one skier from the course; the racer did not want to continue. She left on her own after she was checked by first aid.
  - A lot of smiles today; we're ready to start tomorrow with classic event again.
  - Thank you for your collaboration.

# 13. Information from the OC (Greg Thompson)

 We discussed relay day at the jury meeting today.
 Relays: 9 am Wednesday. Please submit your entries by noon on Tuesday. Greg will send out entry form (to be emailed).

- O JD (John Downing, WMA President): If you prefer to submit a paper entry, one will be made available to you. To make this simple, this is what we are using now: Universal X Rule, which requires one skier in the category to make it a legal team (not two skiers, as in the past). If you fill out paper entry, or online, at top record:
  - Nation, Category
  - Skier name and bib (you can fill this out in order they are going to ski helpful with results) Skier A, B, C, D Bib A, B, C, D (bib number matches age category)
  - Reminder: You can drop skiers down in age, but cannot bump them up in age (i.e. M10 can race as an M5, but not the other way around)
  - Alternates: No need to list two alternates (Universal X Rule easily allows for switches) – if you switch a skier, go to race office and let them know (can be done after the race)
  - If you cannot form a relay team, you can do a mixed team between two nations
  - If you mix two nations, the team is not medal eligible; but if combining gender in your own nation, then medal eligible in men's division.
